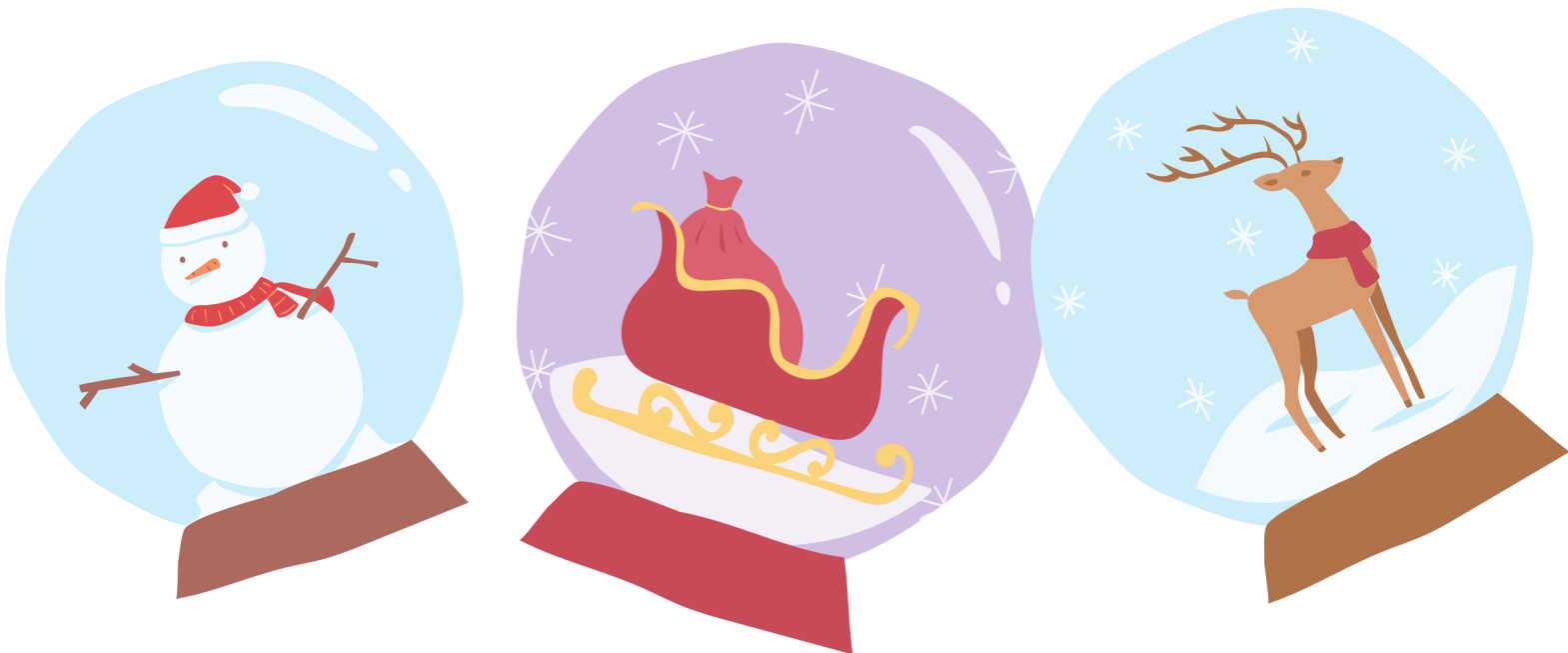


# DIY Snow Globes

## Materials Needed

- Clean, empty jars with tight-sealing lids (like mason jars or baby food jars)
- Distilled water
- Glycerin (available at pharmacies or craft stores)
- Waterproof superglue or epoxy
- Small waterproof figurines or decorations (like plastic or ceramic holiday figures)
- White and/or silver glitter or fake snow
- Optional: Ribbon or paint for decorating the jar lids



### **Prepare the Figurines:**

Choose a figurine that fits inside the jar lid. Make sure it's waterproof and won't dissolve or color the water.

### **Attach the Figurine to the Lid:**

Using the waterproof superglue or epoxy, attach your figurine to the inside of the jar lid.

Allow the glue to dry completely, following the instructions on the glue package.

### **Fill the Jar:**

Fill the jar almost to the top with distilled water.

Add a dash of glycerin to the water. The glycerin thickens the water, which makes the glitter fall more slowly, simulating snowfall.

### **Add Glitter:**

Sprinkle a pinch of glitter or fake snow into the water. You don't need much—just enough to create the “snow” effect when you shake the jar.

### **Seal the Jar:**

Once the figurine's glue is dry and the jar is filled, carefully screw the lid on tightly. You might want to first apply glue to the inner threads of the lid for a waterproof seal.

### **Seal the Edges:**

Apply a layer of glue around the edge where the lid meets the jar to ensure it's watertight.

### **Decorate the Jar:**

Decorate the lid and jar if desired. You can paint the lid, tie a ribbon around the neck of the jar, or even attach decorations to the outside.

### **Final Touch:**

Let everything dry completely. Then, shake your snow globe to see the snowfall effect!
