6. **The Little Prince's Journeys**: The Little Prince travels from planet to planet, meeting various inhabitants. Do these journeys remind you of any experiences you've had in your own life?
7. **Baobab Trees**: The Little Prince worries about baobab trees taking over his planet. What do you think the baobabs symbolize?
8. **The Lamplighter and the Businessman**: Both characters are busy with seemingly pointless tasks. Have you ever found yourself busy with something that didn't really matter in the long run?
9. **The Theme of Appearance vs. Reality**: The book often mentions that “what is essential is invisible to the eye.” What does that mean to you?
10. **Overall Message**: What is the most important message or lesson that you took away from reading "The Little Prince"?

These questions aim to encourage meaningful and emotionally safe discussions among memory care residents. You may adapt them based on the cognitive and emotional comfort levels of your audience.
